80th Anniversary of the Fédération Internationale de Camping, Caravanning et Autocaravaning



June 4 1933 is a landmark date in the 80 year history of our international camping federation because it was on that day that the very first F.I.C.C. General Assembly was held during the very first International F.I.C.C. Rally. In 2011, the term Motorcaravanner was added to the title and logo and, at the beginning of 2012, the Federation's official title changed to "Fédération Internationale de Camping, Caravanning et Autocaravaning".

At the outset, this international association comprised 13 clubs in 7 countries but today the numbers have soared to 70 clubs in 38 countries.

F.I.C.C.'s international youth rallies held at Easter each year started in 1952 and have always been immensely popular as have F.I.C.C.'s annual summer rallies (one of which always includes the annual General Assembly) held in Europe, North America and Asia.

Interest in camping, caravanning and motorcaravanning increases every year and one cannot imagine the tourism industry without this sector now.

It is the feeling of freedom and independence, of being close to nature and the chance to get to know other people and other cultures, that inspire people from all walks of life to go camping.

F.I.C.C.'s objective was, and still is, to encourage and strengthen the bonds of friendship worldwide, not only between its own members but also with the people who live in the countries that host international rallies.

14th ADRIA CAMPING RALLY in Nijvice on the island of Krk/Croatia from 22 to 29 June 2013 under the patronage of F.I.C.C. and organised by Udruga Kampista Hrvatzke

The Nijvice campsite is in a small fishing village on the west coast of the island of Krk. The campsite has been established recently and now has wi-fi internet connection.

The 7-day stay costs €85 per person, teenagers pay half and there is no charge for children under 12 yrs. Registration closes on 1 April 2013.

One can rent caravans for the duration of the rally at a cost of €469 for 5-6 berths.

It is also possible to extend one's stay at a reduced price either before or after the rally (from 13 April - 22 June and 29 June - 05 July = - 20%).

81st International F.I.C.C. Rally in PORI/FINLAND from 24 July to 1 August 2014

The dates for the rally in Finland have finally been fixed.

The town of Pori lies in the west of the country and is the festival capital of Finland. In summer Pori hosts an International Jazz Festival (13 to 20 July), horse-racing (25 to 27 July) and the Porispere Rock Festival on 2 and 3 August.

The rally site Kirjurinluoto has water supply points, showers, toilets, electricity and waste disposal containers. It is near to the town centre.

The rally restaurant is about 500m from the campsite.

The opening ceremony will be at 2 pm on Friday 25 July and the closing ceremony at 10 am on Friday 1 August.

The F.I.C.C. General Assembly will be held at 9 am on Wednesday 30 July in the Promenade Centre, 1.5 kms from the rally site.

Winter hiking keeps your body healthy and helps you unwind

In fact anyone can go hiking in winter. Apart from making sure you have warm, clothes, you don't need to spend a fortune on gear – and, unlike downhill or cross-country ski-ing, no special skills are required.

Hiking keeps you fit and, unlike jogging, is easy on your joints and tendons.

On a long hike, your body produces the happiness hormones serotonin and dopamine: that people generally feel in good form and great spirits after a hike is certainly not a fable but a medically proven fact.

Caravanners feel the same when they go off for a tramp from the campsite in winter. And what could be better than returning to a heated caravan and warming yourself up with a mug of steaming hot chocolate or a glass of mulled wine?

Tips for winter hiking

1) What should I wear?

Layers is the secret for comfortable winter hiking. You need a functional base layer next to your skin to wick away any sweat. Next hikers tend to wear a thin fleece that keeps one warm and shouldn't absorb moisture. The top layer consists of a waterproof jacket and trousers. You will need ankle-high waterproof hiking boots with a good sole and rubber tread to stop you from slipping.

2) What should I do if I sweat?

It is true that sweating a lot is a problem. If you are wearing too much, you will sweat, your clothes will get very damp when you walk and you will get cold as soon as you stop. The best thing for hikers to do if the weather gets warm is to remove a layer and put it back on when they stop. Another tip - regular hikers manage to regulate their body temperature through their head and hands. The body loses most heat this way. If it gets warm, swap your hat for a windproof headband and remove your gloves for a time.

3) What do I need to take with me when hiking?

You should have some food and a thermos flask of hot tea in your rucksack. As your body uses more energy in cold weather, winter hikers need to take something to eat. It's always a good idea to carry a map, a small first aid kit and suncream. As the light usually fades around 4 pm in winter, a head torch could be useful too.

4) How do I plan my hike?

Before setting off, hikers should find out about the length and gradient of their proposed itinerary and plan their route accordingly.

Beginners can start off on by going on a long walk. Then they can tackle a hike in the hills or a low mountain range. It is also sensible to ascertain in advance whether there is anywhere to stop off and whether these places are open.

If it is very windy or snowing heavily, it is better to call the hike off.

France:

- Marseille-Provence is one of the two European Capitals of Culture in 2013.

Ireland – Did you know that 70 million people in the world have Irish roots? To celebrate the fact, this year Ireland is organising a programme entitled “The Gathering” and will be welcoming home anyone who originates from the country. Communities in the Irish Republic will be demonstrating the very best of Irish culture and traditions, from sport to the business world. A number of events are also being organised in Northern Ireland.

TRAFFIC REGULATIONS IN VARIOUS EUROPEAN COUNTRIES

It is mandatory to keep your lights on at all times when driving in the following countries: Austria, Denmark, Estonia, Italy (on motorways), Finland, Poland, Norway, Portugal, Czech Republic, Romania, Slovakia, Sweden and Lithuania. This regulation applies in Latvia between 1 September and 1 April.

Blood alcohol concentration (BAC) limits: In general a BAC of 0.5mg/ml maximum is tolerated. Efforts are being made to standardise legislation throughout Europe but there are a number of countries that still maintain their own BAC limits.

Other BAC limits in Europe are:

0 mg/ml – Estonia, Romania, Slovakia, Czech Republic, Hungary

0.2 mg/ml – Poland, Sweden

0.4 mg/ml – Lithuania

0.8 mg/ml – Ireland, Great Britain, Malta

0.9 mg/ml – Cyprus

It is essential to respect the legal limit because penalties for exceeding the BAC limit are severe in all countries.

Using a mobile phone while driving is strictly forbidden in all European countries. Fines can be as high as €300 (Spain).

The wearing of seat belts is compulsory in all European countries.

In Europe vehicles drive on the left in Great Britain, Ireland, Cyprus and Malta.

In Portugal it is forbidden to transport a bike on the rear of your car.

In Europe you must leave a 5 m. gap between your parked vehicle and a pedestrian crossing, apart from Switzerland where you must leave 10 m.

In Belgium and Portugal you may not park within 20 m. of normal traffic lights.

Parking in central Florence is forbidden between 7am and 6.30pm and in central Rome between 7am and 8 pm.

In Belgium you are obliged to carry a fire extinguisher in your car and in Spain, Denmark and Italy you must have a spare set of light bulbs.

ADVANTAGES OF ORGANISED CAMPING TRIPS

Many camping friends say that they are independent travellers and would not dream of going on an organised camping trip. But there are advantages in setting off with other caravanners as the Swiss travel specialist U. Arber describes below:

- ° One's independence is respected, but the trips do include many worthwhile extra stops.
- ° No-one travels in convoy. Everyone can decide how to spend their day.
- ° You only meet up in the evenings when you stop for the night at the next campsite.
- ° In the evenings there is a meeting of drivers in or next to one of the vehicles. There is no obligation to participate in any events that might be arranged.
- ° People who go on an organised camping trip find that it is a happy mix of being on holiday, meeting people and travelling around. First and foremost an organised camping trip provides company and camaraderie. The organisers seek out the best campsites in attractive locations and select itineraries along scenic routes.
- ° If a ferry is involved, the timing is important as the organiser handles all the booking arrangements.
- ° The best possible support is available if a problem arises (e.g. mechanical problem, illness etc.). It is safer travelling in a group reducing the likelihood of being robbed. And generally speaking, group travel does not work out more expensive than a trip that you organise privately for yourself.

F.I.C.C. Honorary President Camille OLINGER sells his caravan and gives up active camping after more than 50 years!

At the beginning of January 2013, F.I.C.C. received a message in the form of a camping life history from Honorary President Camille Olinger, that he and his beloved partner Jacqueline were giving up camping.

In 1963 he took his late wife Sanny, who died in 1999, and two of his three sons to the first F.I.C.C. rally in Copenhagen and since then he has clocked up 37 international F.I.C.C. rallies to look back on.

In 1987, F.I.C.C. President Ivar Kahl nominated the former F.I.C.C. auditor, Chairman of the Rally Commission and member of the Disciplinary Committee, as Vice-President. Camille Olinger was elected President of the F.I.C.C. federation from 1990 to 1996.

In 1995 Mr. Olinger was awarded the German Camping Prize (Essen Fair).
